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Intraosseous adenoid cystic carcinoma of the mandible: A case report of a rare entity with immunohistochemical presentation and review of the literature

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The Intraosseous salivary gland malignancies are very rare neoplastic tumors. When presented, mucoepedermoid carcinoma is the most common type which makes adenoid cystic carcinoma is even rarer. In a recent review, only 21 cases have been reported.

We report here a unique rare primary intraosseous adenoid cystic carcinoma affecting anterior mandible associated with parathesia of lower lip in a 47 year old female that was confirmed by histopathological and immunohistochemical examinations with the treatment modalities.
